4. PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Mrs. R. McCreath read her report to the
meeting (copy attached)
5. TREASURER'S REPORT: Mr. R. Pearson submitted the audited
accounts for the financial year and recommended that
subscriptions and table money should remain the same for
the ensuing year. This was agreed and the accounts
approved. Mr. Pearson confirmed that he was already
looking into the question of the interest earned on on the
deposit account.
6. MATCH SECRETARY'S REPORT: The Secretary indicated that Mr.
French had a nil report other than to recommend that the
job description be changed to that of Competition
Secretary. This was agreed.

9. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 1993/1994
 - 9.1 The Secretary explained the terms under which The Kings
Arms Hotel was available and it was agreed that they
should continue to be the venue for club events.
The Committee, at the suggestion of Mrs. Martin agreed
to look at the feasibility of The Maltings as an
alternative venue for 1994/1995.

9.2 It was agreed to accept with pleasure the offer made by Mrs. Hazel Woodman on behalf of her late husband, who had the main instigator in the formation of the club in 1972, to present to the club The Tom Woodman Trophy to be played for within the club from 1993/94 onwards. Considerable discussion took place as to the format for this Trophy and it was eventually agreed that the final decision should be left to the Committee who would take into account all the suggestions made.

9.3 The Wilf White Trophy. After discussion it was agreed by 21 votes to 6 that it should remain as a Howell.

10. ANY OTHER BUSINESS:

10.1 Mr. Elder raised the the matter of the President being an appointment traditionally being for three years thus denying many worthy members of having the honour of holding this office. It was pointed out that the constitution did not provide for the position to be other than annual and any specific time restriction would require a change in that constitution. Various alternatives were put forward but after a show of hands leave matters unchanged.

10.2 Concern was expressed as to the lack of etiquette that had arisen recently. It was agreed that this should be watched by the Director on the night.

10.3 It was agreed to continue the Christmas Party night.

10.4 It was agreed to approach The Kings Arms to provide an electric urn for use on club evenings.

10.5 The committee was asked to consider the possibility of providing a floating player to partner someone who might wish to play but did not have a partner. Members were reminded that Mrs. Robson fulfilled that role as partnership secretary but it was agreed that the committee would look again at the position.

11. There being no other business the meeting was closed and followed by the presentation of the club trophies and other prizes and the evening concluded with social bridge.

This is my second year as President of B.B.C. & I am still enjoying being in office. I think that is mainly because I work with such a helpful & enthusiastic committee.

I was sorry to lose John as secretary & I'd like to thank him for all the work he has done for the club & wish him well in his new post.

We have been extremely fortunate, though, in getting Colin to step into the breach & already, in a few short weeks, he has proved to be an invaluable asset to the B.B.C.

To all of you who direct, score, write reports, hand out master points & generally help in the running of the club - a very big thank-you.

We lose Marietta, Alan & George from committee this year & I'd like on behalf of you all to thank them for their help during the past three years. George fortunately, has agreed to continue as Press Secy & for that I am most grateful as we all look forward to his weekly reports in the Berwick Advertiser & occasionally the Berwickshire News. Marguerite has also agreed to carry on as Partner Secy for which service we are most appreciative.

On a much sadder note I'd like to say a few words about Tom Woodman who died this year. Most of us know Tom as a quiet, unassuming gentleman who loved his bridge. What some of our newer members

might not know is that he was one, if not the main instigator in forming this club way back in 1972. Our sympathies go to his widow Hazel who has offered the Bridge Club a cup in memory of Tom. As yet there has been no decision made as to the format of this competition although one or two suggestions have been put forward. The B Team had a moderate season in division 5 winning 4 matches, losing 3 and 2 losing draws. We finished sixth in a division of 10 teams with fourteen points. Fourteen players played for the B Team and it is noticeable that the team played better as a whole when regular partners played with each other. The results show that the three lost games were all with a team which had a pair that were not regular partners. It was not necessarily that pair, who played badly, but the remainder of the team did not perform as well on those nights..

Other than actually playing the cards the B Team had a number of good points.

Firstly, there were no recriminations and team spirit was excellent.

Secondly, I arranged that we played home and away with Longniddry, Haddington, Dunbar and North Berwick which resulted in us having three home matches at Berwick, which incidentally we won all three, This eased travelling, especially for members who live south of Berwick-Upon-Tweed and seemed to be quite acceptable to all concerned.

Thirdly, we had a 'B' Team outing to the Maltings and were excellently entertained during a most enjoyable evening by

Marjorie MacDonald, David Robson and Bill McCreath who were part of the cast in the play "The 12.⁵¹/~~52~~ From York To Berwick".

The B Team has been in the 5th Division for far too long and I now realise to be promoted we must win six games and we have already proved by beating Dunbar and Haddington that we are as good as any team in the league. To obtain promotion we must play steady bridge, bidding and making our games, cutting out silly mistakes such as showing a 2D reply to a 2C opener with a strong hand of diamonds and a slam possible or bidding a risky 7 NT when 6 is adequate. I hope we have learned to wait for the other team to make mistakes rather than compete at the 4 level and be doubled and lose a good score.

If each pair uses this years experience to advantage, if Terry and John benefit from playing with Brian and Robin and we implement the changes I have referred to, and add one or two pairs to make a larger pool, provided you wish me to stay on as Captain I expect to report back in a years time that we have been promoted to Division 4. This would be good for the 'B' Team and also good for the Berwick Bridge Club.

Finally I would like to thank a number of people, the team for their effort, David and Jill Robson, Margaret Patterson, Kate Mole, Tony Oates and Diana for helping out at short notice when we needed extra players and also Jean for organising the supper at both Berwick and Haddington.
